The meeting also took action on the matter of the superintendency of the Plattsmouth water plant, of which T. H. Pollock has been in charge since the resignation of L. O. Minor last year.

The directors selected Mr. Pollock to formally take over the office and serve as the superintendent in the future. This is no new post for Mr. Pollock, however, he having served as superintendent here for a number of years, being connected with the water plant for the greater part of the time from 1898 to 1910.

Mr. Pollock's long experience with the affairs of the plant and his general business knowledge makes him a most efficient officer for the company, one who has very ably filled the post since the departure of Mr. Minor.
