From Journal, Dec. 7, 1891: Saturday evening occurred a largely-attended meeting of McConihe post, Grand Army of the Republic at their hall in the Rockwood building. The occasion was the election of officers for the ensuing year. Arrangements had been made by the W. R. C. for paying a fraternal visit to the post, without knowing of the important business on hand in the post, but this program was somewhat interfered with, and the ladies were compelled to wait for some time in the ante room.
