The Holy Spirit Inspires New Testament Letters

Gal. 1:11-12, I Thes. 2:13; II Tim. 3:14-17; I Pet. 3:14-16 and Jude 3.

Without the inspired word of God, man could never find his way back to God. The writing of the Scriptures covers a period of over 1,600 years.

The Bible is inexhaustible—a hundred volumes are written per year, bringing out new truths. It is like a living spring or fountain, ever giving forth new life to a parched land.

We look at some of the characteristics in these letters and they all serve but one purpose, namely to make man acquainted with his maker, in other words to reveal God to man, and to impart this knowledge to man.
