EIGHTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE RETURN OF LEGAL BEER

LINCOLN, Aug. 13-Sunday was the eighth anniversary of the return of legal beer to Nebraska.

On August 10, 1933, the sale of beer was resumed after a 16-year "dry" period, under provisions of a statute passed by the 1933 legislature legalizing 3.2 beer.

This legislation was superseded in 1935 by the present Nebraska liquor control act providing for the sale of both beer and liquor and placing ad-State Liquor Control Commission.


