The mound was reserved exclusively for southpaws as stubby Russ Nielsen hurled the distance for Plattsmouth, allowing eight hits and fanning nine; Burt Alfrey worked four innings, allowing five hits and whiffing seven, and ambidextrous Harvey Blair switched to his port side and chucked three frames giving five hits and two strikeouts. Bud Vroman led the Blue Devils at bat, hitting three doubles and a triple in five trips to the plate. Blair and D. Alfrey each got two hits to lead Louisville.
