Labor Shortage on Farms Found to Be Very Acute

Cass County USDA Board Seeks Registration of All Unemployed Farm Workers Available

Reports are reaching the Cass County USDA Board of an acute shortage of labor in this area, it was announced by local board members. Farmers have suggested that they would be compelled to curtail production in some of the most sorely needed commodities unless something is immediately accomplished to relieve the local labor situation.

The immediate objective in Cass county should be the following: (1) Registration of all unemployed farm workers and members of farm families unemployed and available for work.

(2) Registration of all farm laborers, operators and members of farm families who are partially employed but would be available for part-time work on other farms.

(3) Registration of all operators of farm equipment who perform custom work. (The Cass County USDA War Board will this week obtain information on how much customing and harvesting 1942 crops tom work will have to be done in and what is the available supply of such custom work. This information will be obtained by mailing out cards on which farm operators will

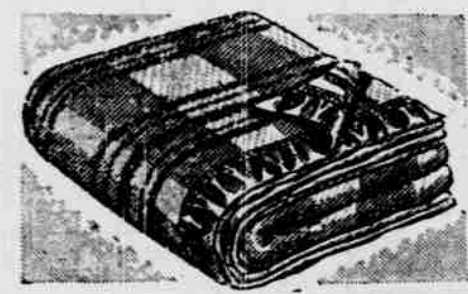
