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Roosevelt Asks More Control Of Co-operation

Asks Right to Suspend Laws That Interfere With the Movement of Supplies and Personnel

WASHINGTON, Nov. 2. (UP)—President Roosevelt today asked congress for authority to suspend all laws that interfere with free movement of war supplies and personnel into and out of this country.

The White House sent to congress a special message outlining the difficulties of international cooperation among the United Nations and asking for broad authority to deal with the problem. The message emphasized that Mr. Roosevelt wanted the extraordinary powers only for the duration of the war.

The President said that the barriers which were slowing down our war production effort fell into two classes:

1. Customs laws and laws checking the movement of persons and

property at American borders and ports.

2. Laws which limit the procurement of use of pan-American articles for the transport of supplies in non-American ships.

"To achieve an all out war production effort," the president told congress, "We must implement and supplement the steps already taken by the congress and the president to eliminate those peace time restrictions which limit our ability to make the fullest and quickest use of the world's resources."

Mr. Roosevelt said he was not recommending repeal or amendment of the peacetime restrictive laws but that he preferred the executive authority to suspend them when such action was deemed necessary.
