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Samuel Gramlich Dies At Home Near Fort Crook

One of The First White Children Born in Sarpy County Passes Away At 87 Years

Samuel W. Gramlich, widely known over eastern Nebraska, died Wednesday at his home near Fort Crook, the second Sarpy county pioneer to die in as many days. Mr. Gramlich would have been 87 years of age in January.

The parents of Mr. Gramlich left Illinois for California in 1855, and when they arrived at Council Bluffs, then Kanesville, they found they were to late to join that year's wagon train for the west and accordingly crossed the Missouri river and located in Sarpy county. In the then pioneer territory Mr. Gramlich was born and when a year old his parents moved to the present Gramlich farm where he has since resided.

Mr. Gramlich retired from active farming in 1941 and for the past five months has suffered from the illness that has proven fatal.

In 1937 Gramlich planted his sixth orchard—he had outlived five others. The Gramlich's celebrated their sixty-second wedding anniversary on September 14.

Nine children, 21 grand children and 12 great-grandchildren survive. Sons are Alois, Fort Crook, and Fred, Millard; daughters, Matilda and Mary, Fort Crook; Edith, Pekin, Ill.; Mrs. Alice Brazner, Griswold, Ia.; Mrs. Cordelia Frazum, Papillion; Mrs. Barbara Callaway, Red Bluff, Cal.; Mrs. Mattie Ziesler, Inglewood, Cal.

FHA Urges The Remodeling Of Old Residences

Conversion Into Apartment Houses Is Urged To Provide Quarters For War Workers

Conversion of large home properties into small apartments offering housing accommodations for war workers is a patriotic as well as profitable move said Holger Holm, state director, Federal Housing Administration, today.

The conversion of these older properties is providing living accommodations at a speed, economy, and saving of critical materials that would be impossible through new construction. It is much easier and faster to take a large home that is in reasonably sound condition and turn it into a four-family apartment dwelling, for instance, than it would be to start from scratch to build a house providing that many units.

The need for housing accommodations for war workers is vital. These people must be housed, if war industry plants are to be kept at peak production. And the quickest and easiest way to provide many accommodations is through the conversion of existing homes. The wartime curb on new building has reached the point where new construction alone cannot be relied upon to provide the necessary housing for war workers. But even if materials were available, the need for accommodations is so immediate that in many areas the time required for new construction cannot be spared.

The older homes, in most instances have the advantages of all necessary utility connections, and many are located convenient to public transportation systems. Usually they call for far less in the amount of critical materials needed to put them in condition.

While a recently inaugurated program provides for the conversion of existing home properties through the use of Federal funds, Government housing officials also point out that much of this type of work can be financed with private capital. Property owners and private lending institutions are being urged to cooperate in the task of providing housing for war workers through the converting of existing homes.

If you are the owner of a large property, located in a war industry area, and that is only partially occupied, you have a direct responsibility to make part of that space available to war workers. For full information as to financing and how to convert your home, apply at your local FHA office, or any lending institution qualified by the FHA to make insured loans.
