More Beef Needed

Conditions indicate that the nation will need more beef than we can produce and our need for feed grains for other classes of livestock is such that grain should be used economically in feeding beef cattle, Prof. Marvel Baker of the Univerity of Nebraska College of Agricul- by enrolling in the short course ofture said this week.

For a large proportion of Nebraska producers this means carrying cattle for a somewhat longer period with the use of relatively larger quantities of roughage than usual. Palatable roughage of good quality should be used if gains are to be rapid and economical. Alfalfa hay, good quality prairie hay, silage, and the fodders may all be used.

Maximum consumption should be encouraged and in the case of coarser feeds this means that running them through a cutter or grinder may prove profitable. Clarke-McNary Trees Listed

on the Clarke-McNary list for 1942-43. As before, orders for the seedlings will be taken during the winter months and delivery will be made at planting time next spring. Cost of all varieties will be \$1 per hundred, or 1 cent each.

The complete list includes American elm. Chinese elm, mulberry. cottonwood, green ash, hackberry, honey locust, black locust, Russian olive, wild plum, boxelder, caragana, soft maple, chokecherry, yellow pine, Austrian pine, jack pine and red cedar.

Extension Forester Earl G. Maxwell of the Nebraska College of Agriculture recently pointed out that seedlings often can be planted before farm work starts. Fall plowing the ground, leaving it rough saves on labor required next spring.

More Hogs for Neoraska As more farmers and organizations boost the expanded hog production program for Nebr., in 1943, interest among Cass County farmers indicate a desire on the part of everyone to produce pork to the limti next spring. A forty percent increase for the state as a whole has been requested to meet wartime food needs. Information just received as this is being written, indicates Secretary of Agriculture Wickard has revised upward previously 1943 hog production goals and at the same time announced a program to support hog prices at an average of \$13.25 per hundred, Chicago basis until December 30th, 1944.

The Agricultural Extension Service and the Agricultural Experiment Station of the University of Nebraska College of Agriculture are using their full facilities to help farmers increase production, wherever possible. All of the experimental data for many years of work, along with practical farm experiences gathered, is being made available to farmers.

The statewide hog production program was formulated several weeks back at the University of Nebraska College of Agriculture and has the full support of all groups. The first step in getting the expanded increase in hog numbers has been the countywide hog surveys conducted by county extension agents to determine how many farmers need breeding stock and how wany have surplus breeding stock for sale.
