In September 1913 Orion married Marie Swartz of Elmwood. Soon afterwards they moved to Denver, where they have since resided.

Orion had a kind, sympathetic, jovial disposition, which endeared him to his family and friends.

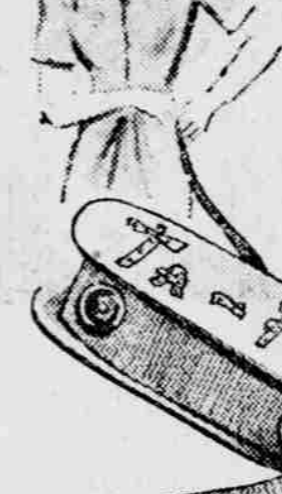
