Farm Loan Associations

Notices of a special meeting on Thursday and Friday, October 14 and 15 have been sent to all stockholder members of the Alvo, Nehawka, Greenwood and Otoe County National Farm Loan associations, it was announced today by Harold C. Elliott, secretary-treasurer of the associations, which headquarters at Weeping Water.

The meeting is being called to review action taken by boards of directors of the associations into one, and to consider other phases of the Federal Land Bank's plan of organization.

The reorganization plan proposes full payment, at par value, for National farm loan association stock now held by farmers and stockmen who have paid off their loans but not yet received payment for their stock in impaired associations in the four states served by the Omaha land bank. Consolidation of associations was approved by the boards to insure better service to present and future members at minimum cost.

No B and C Ration Appeals Before October 15

Application for restoration of B and C gasoline ration cuts now in effect in the Middle West cannot be made to the local board before October 15, Mr. W. G. Boedeker, chairman of the Cass County War Price and Rationing board, announced today. B and C coupons were reduced from three gallons to two gallons. Mr. Boedeker assured war workers and others employed in essential industry that they will be able to get to work, but added that applicants for restoration of coupon cuts must show proof of need. Pending receipt of instructions, he said, the board will use the present table of issuing new or renewal gasoline rations. "A" coupon values remain at three gallons each.

"Our board has been instructed to scan every application closely," Mr. Boedeker said. "The needs of our military forces ever increasing with increased activities on many battlefronts, must come first. I want to appeal to every car owner to think twice before applying to boards for restoration of the cuts. Likewise every essential war worker may be assured that his actual needs will be met."

Dealers will be allowed through October 6 to dispose of coupons taken at the old value basis, either to their suppliers at the time of supply replenishment or to the boards for inventory coupons. All coupons exchanged by dealers at different unit figures must be separately summarized on Form R-451.

Distributions are allowed through October 11 to deposit coupons honored on the old basis. Mr. Boedeker said. Distributors must complete separate deposit slips for each deposit at different values.
