These figures represent as shown the condition of the funds in our county treasury. In addition to the sum as shown the court house has been improved by repairing of the roof, the redecoration of the interior, and a new lighting system to be installed, modernized boiler rooms in the building. We expect to extend this plan to include the redecoration of all of the offices. An inspector has been built at the jail, a new modern double garage has been built that eliminated the need for the costly paying out sums for our storage.

All of these improvements have been made without the need of increasing the taxes. In fact, it has been possible to make small reductions in the taxes.

I feel that an investigation of my record as commissioner will show my sincerity in saving the taxpayers where possible. You will find that the first district has put road equipment that will be used for the building and upkeep of the roads.

It is my intention to undertake a system of connecting, grading and well maintained roads in the First District including the Myland road, the Cedar Creek road, the Rock Hill road and the Louderdale road is placed in shape to serve the public until the federal and state take over the highway.

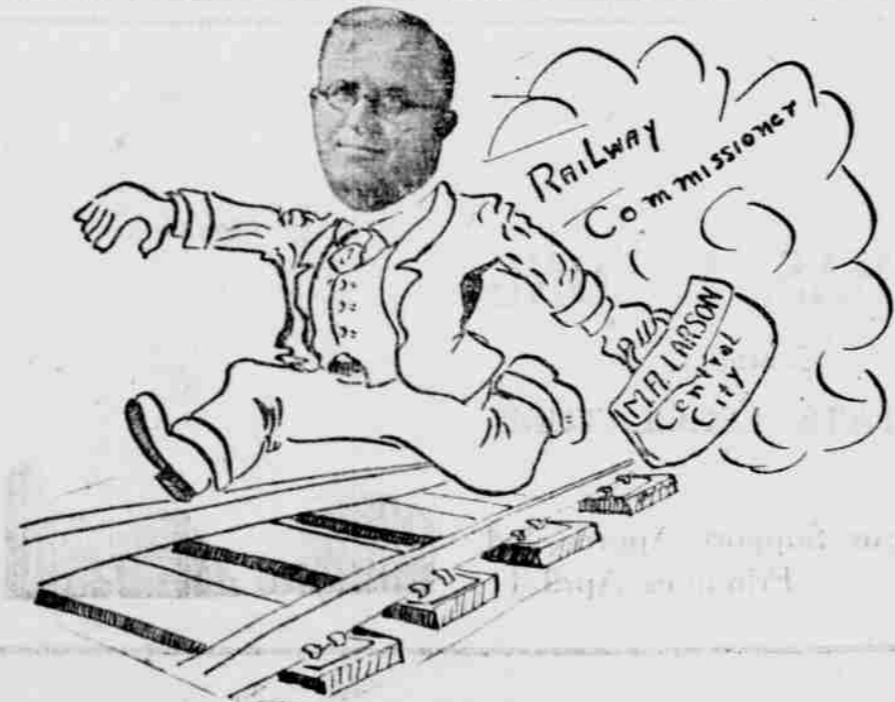
