OBITUARY

Albert Streich
Albert Streich was born February 22, 1864, in Reppin, Pommern, Germany, and died May 9, 1944, at the age of 80 years, 2 months and 16 days.

In 1890 he was married to Mary with his parents, when 19 years of age, and settled near Louisville, Neb. Six years later, in 1899, he came to this community and that same year joined the Callahan Evangelical church, to which he was loyal unto death.

In 1890 he was united to Mary Dettman and lived on a farm west of Murdock, until 1934 when they moved to Murdock.

Into this home six children were born, Gus, Will, Martin, Ervin, Harry and Lydia. They also made a home for Hazel Eikerman-Miller, a foster daughter.

Ervin and Harry preceded him in death.

The great interest of his life was the Kingdom of God and the welfare of his family.

He was converted in his youth and became a true follower of his Christ.

He was held in such high esteem by his church that he was entrusted with the offices of steward, trustee and teacher in the Bible School.

He leaves the memories of a consecrated devoted Christian life which are beyond price.

There remain to mourn his death, his wife, Gus, Will, Lydia and Hazel Miller, also seven grandchildren and many relatives and friends.

Services were held on Thursday afternoon at the Callahan church, with Rev. F. S. Weber in charge, and interment was in the cemetery near the church.

U. S. Casualties

Washington, May 12. (UP)—Announced casualties of the U. S. army forces now total 291,454, an increase of 3,581 above the figure a week ago, it was revealed today.

Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson told a press conference army casualties totalled 156,767 as of April 28th. Of these 27,297 were killed, 64,321 wounded, 33,715 missing and 31,343 prisoners of war. He added that 37,009 of the wounded have returned to duty.

A navy casualty list released today showed 44,778 casualties among the navy, coast guard and marine corps. Of these 19,221 were dead, 12,070 wounded, 9,034 missing and 30,196 prisoners.

Reduce Hog Ceiling

Washington, May 12. (UP)—The Office of Price Administration today formalized a previously announced order specifying a reduction of 75c per cwt. in the ceiling price of live hogs weighing more than 240 pounds.

The action, effective Monday was taken to discourage the feeding of corn to heavy weight hogs and to encourage the marketing of hogs before they reach 240 pounds. The ceiling is now \$14.00 cwt., Chicago base.

GRANT WARD CASE DISMISSAL

Chicago, May 12. (U)—Federal Judge Wm. H. Holly ended the court phase of the Montgomery Ward seizure today by granting the government's request for dismissal of the case without prejudice.

Counsel for the company had asked that the injunction proceedings be dismissed with prejudice, a ruling which would have prevented the government from re-opening the same injunction case.

The agreement to dismiss the proceedings was made by opposing counsel Wednesday after Judge Holly announced that return of the Chicago properties of Montgomery Ward to the company had made it necessary for the government, after seizure of the plant April 26th had asked Holly for him to rule upon the injunction, to join company officials from interfering with government operation.

Judge Holly in dismissing the case without prejudice said that after reading the records of similar cases which had come before the supreme court, he could not "see what other thing I could do."

I. NAME

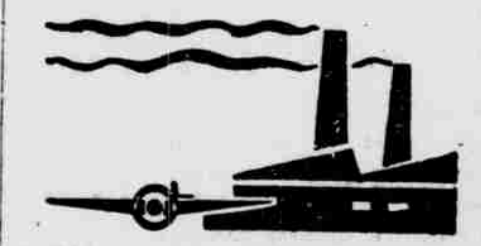
IV. CAPITAL STOCK
