BOARD OF EQUALIZATION 1944

Office of County Commissioners Cass County
Plattsmouth, Nebraska, August 10, 1944

The County Board of Equalization met at the call of the County Clerk as provided by law. Present H. C. Backemeyer, S. T. Gilmour and G. W. Hart, County Commissioners, and Geo. R. Sayles, County Clerk. Absent County Assessor W. H. Puls.

The following business was transacted in regular form:
County Assessor W. H. Puls had returned the total assessed valuation of \$35,303,455 of the county for the year 1944.

The State Levy for 1944 was certified to the Board at 2.54 mills. The County Board made a Levy of .30 mills for the expense of Cass County patients in State Insane Hospitals, making the Total State Levy 2.84 mills.

1944 County Levies were made as follows: General Fund, 1.40 mills; Bridge Fund, .76 mills; Emergency Bridge Fund, .20 mills; Road Fund, including Drag Fund, 1.40 mills; Poor Relief Fund, .06 mills; Soldiers Relief Fund, .01 mills; Mothers Pension Fund, .03 mills. Total County Levy 3.56 mills, making the Total State and County Levy 6.40 mills.

A Levy of \$3.00 per capita was made for Old Age Assistance Fund.
A Levy of 25¢ per \$100 for Class "A" and 80¢ per \$100 for Class "B" was made for the Intangible Tax. A Levy of 10¢ per stand was made for the Bee Tax.

The County Superintendent certified a Levy of 1.2 mills for High School Tuition Tax, which was approved by the Board.
