Food For Folks

Foods for Freedom—U. S. Needs Us Strong.

Building a child is building a nation. Our children are our hope in the future. Their mental, moral, and physical development, to the fullest measure of their possibility, is our greatest responsibility. The home, the church and the school are united in their effort to bring about such all-round development as will result in efficient and responsible citizenship.

It is not possible to divide the child into three parts—mental, moral and physical—and to assign to the school the mental child, to the church, the moral child and to the home, the physical child. It is the whole child in whom we are interested. It is the whole child who is growing, developing, acquiring new knowledge, skills and attitudes.

September was designated as the Wartime Nutrition month. During that period, the subject of nutrition was given the national spotlight, and will be continued in the future. This theme is being played up in national magazines, and on national radio network programs. State and local newspapers have caught the spirit and are printing articles on nutrition.

All the problems that come up when school starts aren't in the books. One of the biggest ones doesn't have anything to do with classes. It's the problem that comes up when the noon bell rings and the children pour out of school rooms, ready for lunch.

True, many can go home, but there are others who because home is too far away or who because their mothers are working, must face the noon recess with a cold lunch, often packed in a hurry and more often lacking in foods which make for an alert pupil during the afternoon.

Three steps are necessary to pack a lunch that packs a punch:

1. Planning
 - (a) Follow the Basic 7 Food guide.
 - (b) A lunch should provide one third the daily food needs.
 - (c) When meat is scarce, use fish or poultry, eggs, cheese, baked beans, peas or soybeans, or peanut butter for sandwich filling.
 - (d) Always include a vegetable and fruit, raw, cooked, or a juice.
2. Preparation

Save food values and time. Use more raw fruits and vegetables
3. Packing

Wrap sandwiches, raw vegetables and fruit in waxed paper (use bread wrappers)
Pack salads, puddings and stewed fruit in screw top jars.
For variety and food values pack dried fruit and nuts in lunch.

Here are some school lunch menus:

1. American cheese and tomato sandwich on enriched bread. Baked bean and chopped peanut sandwich on whole wheat bread. Carrot strips, fruits in season, gingerbread, milk.
2. Meat loaf sandwich, chopped celery, green pepper, and cottage cheese sandwich on whole wheat bread, peanut butter and shredded carrot on enriched bread, apple, molasses cup cake, milk.

Other sandwich fillings:
Chopped egg and sweet relish
Peanut butter and jelly
Peanut butter with chopped apple or cooked prune pulp
Ground cheese with green pepper
Baked beans with minced onion and pickle
