of them. Irrigation in the North Platte valley makes it possible to fatten 50,000 head of cattle and 500,000 head of sheep annually on sugar beet byproducts, feeds and grains raised there.

"Reduction in sugar beets throughout the U.S. in 1943 represented a loss in feeding byproducts equivalent to 170,000,000 bushels of wheat. As a result, consumption of wheat, both in industry and in livestock feeding, had to be curtailed because not even our imports could cover the shortage.

"In Nebraska, four sugar factories were closed in 1943, which meant a loss to business generally. At Minatare the single item of coal amounted to 272 carloads lost to mine operators; railroad crews who would have hauled the beets, coal and other materials incident to sugar manufacture, lost \$6,000 in wages.

"I haven't even mentioned the loss this one closed factory meant to the farmer and livestock interests, both feeder and processor, through loss of byproducts of the sugar industry which are excellent livestock feeds, and the manure which is essential for maintaining production of crops under irrigation.

"The railroads are making plans to assume their full measure of the load when the shooting stops. They stand ready to streamline their plant as soon as priorities and funds permit. A few examples of planned improvements are: greater use of centralized traffic control; additional installation of classification or 'hump' yards; radio communication on trains and between trains and fixed points; better locomotives, both diesel and steam; improved spaciousness in riding qualities of passenger cars; and various improvements in freight handling rolling stock.

lington territory, it was found that the rail income was dependent upon the degree of prosperity of agriculture. By the way, that holds true on all Class I railroads in our country, even though some of them may not originate large volumes of agriculture products. This study, covering a 20-year period, shows that Burlington revenues have followed farm revenues, usually being about six months behind farm revenues in the direction in which they were moving.

"All of us, whether we like it or not, are interested in seeing the farmer receive a fair income for his crops, as this factor seems to affect our revenues to an even greater extent than the quantity of his production. Although it isn't so clearly defined, we believe also that the prices farmers receive for their products depend in a large measure on the ability of the public to buy. In other words, there is a strong interdependence between the farm and business of all kinds. We can only hope that the extent of business activities stimulated by proposed improvements in all lines of business as well as by the railroad, will keep farm income on a high plane. Also, that this high plane of farm income coupled with high returns to labor, will enable ourselves as well as other businesses to carry on with the extensive improvements now being planned.
