**GOOD BREEDING PAYS**

Howard Capwell who farms near Elmwood is one Cass County farmer who believes in using good sires. He has a good reason in his belief for he recently collected fully 50 cent per hundred more on the Omaha market for his native lambs than other droves brought that day. He used two purebred Hampshire rams on his grade flock of ewes, and gives them credit for the premium received.

Capwell's lambs were born the last of April and during May. The flock was grazed on good bromegrass and some alfalfa pasture until the lambs turned into the corn field where they fattened during a six week period before marketing. The best ewe lambs were kept for breeding purposes. The rest of the crop numbering 36 head averaged 106 lbs. at the Omaha Market and brought \$14.50 per hundred. Most of the native lambs sold that day brought less than \$14.00.
