Plane Carrying Wacs Missing in Africa

WASHINGTON, (AP)—An army transport plane carrying 18 Wacs and a crew of three has been missing in Africa since May 30th, the war department announced Wednesday. The plane was lost on a 766 mile flight from Accra, on the gold coast of British West Africa to Roberts field Liberia.

The plane was last reported over Takoradi, British West Africa, 150 miles west of the take off point. Aircraft and surface vessels are searching for it over a wide area of French ivory coast.

The Wacs had been stationed at the air transport command base at Accra since last October. They were being sent on new assignments.

A war department spokesman pointed out that approximately 17,000 members of the Women's Corps have been sent abroad. These were the first ones missing in transit overseas in this war.
