

Actress Ava Gardner Marries Artie Shaw

HOLLYWOOD, Oct. 18.—(AP)—Actress Ava Gardner, ex-wife of Mickey Rooney, today started a stay-at-home honeymoon with her husband Artie Shaw, 35, ex-husband of Jerome Kern's daughter, Betty and Mrs. Turner's daughter, Lana.

Their marriage last night came close on the heels of an announcement from Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer studio, for whom the 21-year-old bride makes movies, that Miss Gardner and the handsome Shaw would not be married for a day or so.

At the Movies

Greer Garson and Walter Pidgeon, the incomparable and unforgettable team which made boxoffice history with "Mrs. Miniver," "Blossoms in the Dust" and "Madame Curie," are together again on the screen in "Mrs. Parkington," as two of fiction's most colorful characters, in one of the year's lustiest love stories.

Based on Louis Bromfield's best selling novel, the Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer film version of "Mrs. Parkington," which opens Sunday at the Cass Theatre, marks a distinct departure from previous "husband and wife" portrayals of Pidgeon and Miss Garson. Fine, gayety, power, worldliness are the dominating characteristics of Susie and Major Augustus Parkington.

Encompassing a colorful period from 1872 to 1938, "Mrs. Parkington" gives Miss Garson her most fascinating, as well as her most difficult screen character-

ization. As Susie, the star "ages" from 18 to 83 and develops from a naive daughter of a Nevada boarding-house keeper into an international beauty and wit and finally into a wise, witty, regal matriarch.

A decided-transition from his shy, scientifically-minded Pierre Curie, Pidgeon, as Major Parkington, is a swashbuckling, ruthless, yet always charming empire builder; a rugged character who delights in rich living and the company of a pretty woman.

Few motion pictures can boast such an imposing cast as has been selected to aid Miss Garson and Pidgeon in bringing "Mrs. Parkington" to the screen.

Edward Arnold heads the brilliant supporting cast as pompous Amory Stilman, financier who brings disaster on the Parkingtons. In her biggest and most colorful screen role, Agnes Moorehead, who won the New York Critics' Award a year ago for her performance in "The Magnificent Ambersons," appears as Baroness Aspasia Conti, clever, chic, Frenchwoman, who, though she has been the Major's lover, becomes Susie's dearest friend.

Veteran actress Gladys Cooper, Academy Award contender for her performance as the nun in "The Song of Bernadette," appears in the 1938 sequences, as Mrs. Parkington's daughter, Alice, the tipsy Duchess de Brancourt.

Victor Monterio, now an ordinance worker at the Watertown, Mass., Arsenal, once held checker championships in 10 states, spent his evenings giving exhibitions, playing blindfolded, and playing against as many as 25 opponents at the same time.

SUGAR: War Ration Book IV, Sugar Stamp No. 38, good for five pounds, will remain valid through December 31.

SHOES: War Ration Book III, Aeroplane Stamps No. 1, No. 2, No. 3 and No. 4, good for one pair of shoes each for an indefinite period.

MEATS: War Ration Book IV, Red Stamps A1, B1, C1, D1, and E1, good through October 31, Stamps F1, G1, H1, J1, and K1, good through November 30, Stamps L1, M1, N1, P1 and Q1, good through December 31, Stamps R1, S1, T1, U1 and V1 became valid October 1, good through January 31.
