**NEW YORK, (UP)—** General Dwight D. Eisenhower, army chief of staff, branded as absurd Wednesday night charges that the American army is a threat to other people.  
 "A few possibly from sincere motives allege that this army is a disturbing element in the world scene, terming it a standing threat to other peoples," Eisenhower said in an address to the New York Herald Tribune forum.  
 "But the countries against which it is hinted our army may be aimed do not need intelligence sources to recognize the absurdity of such charges." The former allied commander said the American army at home formed the "merest nucleus for security and the 'badly diminishing' forces abroad were there only to maintain order and fulfill American promises to help restore peace to the world.
