Probe Damage To Burlington Wires McCook, Neb.—Burlington Division headquarters here revealed that FBI and railroad agents are searching for the person or persons who cut the wires on the railroad's centralized traffic control system between Parks, Neb. and Laird, Colo., on the nights of Oct. 31 and Nov. 1. Investigators said that the serial cable was cut in four different places and 100 foot sections carried away. Accidents on the line were averted because each cut flashed a signal light on the central control board and repairs were made within two hours.
