Washington, (UPI). Amid the threat of a new coal strike House Rep. Whip Leslie C. Ahrens of Illinois, Monday called for a revision of labor laws "at the earliest possible moment by the new GOP congress."

Ahrens said the answer might be reintroduction and passage of the Case strike control bill which was passed by the last congress but vetoed by president Truman.

It was a good bill then and it's a good bill now," he said, directed against the interests of the workers. On the contrary, it maintains steady employment and was a measure designed to help protect the rights of workers against the convicting of irresponsible labor leaders.

Ahrens said the Republican landslide in the November 5th elections amounted to repudiation of Mr. Truman's Case bill veto. He did not rule out the possibility of revisions in the measure but said they should be along "Changes should give full and fair and impartial lines."
