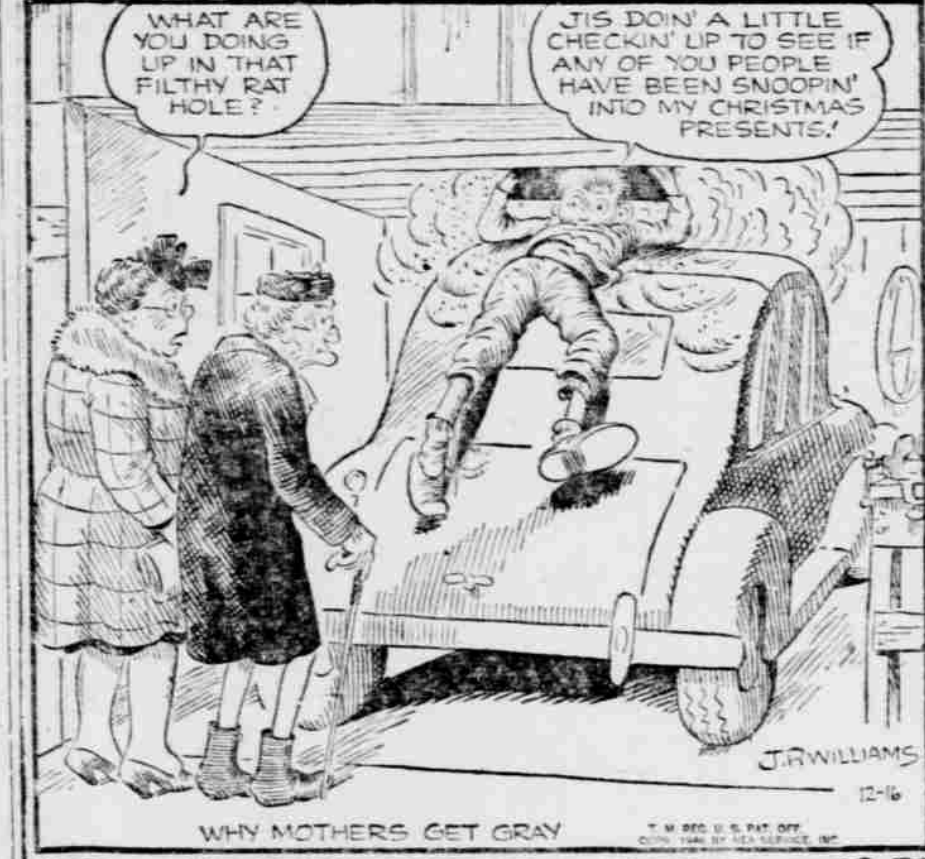

The coal crisis and resultant rail embargo have spotlighted speculation on degree to which the nation's railroads are turning to oil and electricity as motive power. Chart above shows number of non-steam locomotives in service early this year on Class 1 railroads and the great contrast in the number of new ones ordered, as against new steam locomotives. However, railroads still use about 115,000,000 tons of coal annually—over a sixth of normal output.
