- This "appetite-awakener." Flanked Mackerel. Select firm-fleshed fish. Use whole fish, split down back and dry thoroughly. Season sides with salt and pepper and brush with oil or melted fat. Place, skin-side down, on oiled hot plank or ovenware platter and bake in hot oven (450° F.) for 15 to 30 minutes, basting frequently. Remove from oven, border with Mashed Potatoes, brush with melted butter, milk or diluted egg yolk and brown in oven or under broiler.
