Ordinance No. 808 AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE OPERATION AND PARKING OF MOTOR VEHICLES IN THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA...

Be It Ordained By the Mayor and City Council of the City of Plattsmouth.

Section 1. Speed Limits: No person shall drive a motor vehicle on any street within this city at a rate of speed greater than is reasonable and prudent...

or at a rate of speed greater than 25 miles per hour, which is hereby declared to be PRIMA FACIE lawful. Section 2. Reckless driving: No vehicle shall be driven, used, operated, parked or stopped in a careless, reckless or negligent manner...

minutes between the hours of 2:00 o'clock a. m. and 6:00 a. m. from the first day of March until the first day of October of each year, on the following streets in this city, to-wit: Main Street, from Third Street to 6th Street...

is marked or used for diagonal parking, or upon Main Street from 3rd Street to 8th Street, or upon Sixth Street within one block of Main Street. (b) Loading and Unloading: No truck shall be parked for the purpose of loading or unloading in the street in any place of business within the area described in Section 8 Paragraph 4 above...

SUGGESTIONS FOR THE GRADUATE

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WELL DRILLING

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Section 7. Disabled Vehicles: It shall be unlawful to cause or permit any disabled vehicle, or vehicle undergoing repairs, or any vehicle not capable of operating under its own power, to remain upon any street or alley in this city for more than twelve hours, and it shall be unlawful to make any repairs to vehicles on the streets of this city where such repairs cannot be completed within two hours time. Section 8. Parking in Driveways or Alleys or Across Streets: It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle in such a manner as to block or partially block or obstruct any private driveway or public alley, or to park any vehicle, including trucks for the purpose of unloading the same, in such a manner that the same or any part thereof extends beyond the center of the street or paved portion thereof. Section 9. Removal of Unlawfully Parked Vehicles: In the event any vehicle is parked in such a manner as to violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, the police or street commissioner may order the same removed, and the owner or operator thereof shall reimburse the City for expense of removing or towing such vehicle from the street, and shall pay any expense charges in connection therewith, in addition to any fine and costs which may be imposed for such violation. Section 10. Stop Signs: Any person operating a motor vehicle on any street or alley shall stop at a stop sign placed at the intersection of any street or alley and shall stop and remain in such position until the vehicle or fire department vehicle shall have passed. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle other than one on official business to follow any fire apparatus or fireman's automobile equipped with siren or red light, traveling in response to a fire alarm, closer than five hundred feet, or to drive into or park such vehicle within the block where the fire apparatus has stopped in answer to a fire alarm. Section 11. Any violations: Possibilities: Any person operating any vehicle in violation of any of the provisions of the preceding sections of this article, shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine in the sum of \$1.00 to \$50.00 or confined to jail for a period not to exceed 10 days or both for each offense; and the actual cost or expenses incurred. Section 12. In the event any portion or paragraph of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, such invalidity shall not effect the validity of any other section or paragraph. Section 13. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of Section 1 to 12 are hereby repealed. Section 14. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication. Passed and approved this 12th day of May, 1947. CLEMENT T. WOSTER, Mayor.
