ORDINANCE NO. 809
AN ORDINANCE VACATING A CERTAIN ALLEY IN BLOCK 73 IN THE ORIGINAL CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH AND IN BLOCK 13 IN TOWNSEND'S ADDITION TO THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH; A CERTAIN ALLEY IN BLOCK 90 IN THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH; A CERTAIN ALLEY IN BLOCK 6 IN WHITE'S ADDITION TO THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, AND BLOCK 3 IN MICKLEWALT'S ADDITION TO THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH; ALSO COURTLAND STREET, ALSO KNOWN AS AVENUE F, AND WALNUT STREET, ALSO KNOWN AS AVENUE E, BOTH FROM FOURTH STREET TO FIFTH STREET; AND GOLD STREET FROM FIFTH STREET TO SIXTH STREET, ALL IN THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, CASS COUNTY, NEBRASKA; DESIGNATING THE REVERSION OF TITLE HERETO; PROVIDING FOR EFFECTIVE DATE AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska:
Section 1.—That the following streets and alleys in the City of Plattsmouth be and the same are hereby vacated, to-wit:
The alley running east and west through Block 73 of the original City of Plattsmouth and Block 13 in Townsend's Addition to the City of Plattsmouth;
The alley running east and west through Block 90 in the City of Plattsmouth;
The alley running east and west through Block 6 in White's Addition to the City of Plattsmouth;
The alley running east and west through Block 3 in Mickelwalt's Addition to the City of Plattsmouth;
Courtland Street, also known as Avenue F, between Fourth Street and Fifth Street in the City of Plattsmouth;
Walnut Street, also known as Avenue E, from Fourth Street to Fifth Street in the City of Plattsmouth;
Gold Street from Fifth Street to Sixth Street in the City of Plattsmouth.
The title to said streets and alleys shall revert to the owners of the real estate adjacent to and on each side thereof, provided however the same shall be and remain subject to existing easements and franchises for public utilities.
Section 2.—All expenses connected with the vacation and discontinuance of said alleys and streets shall be paid for by the persons petitioning the City Council for the same.
Section 3.—This ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.
All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
