The State and Federal Government are striving for a better quality in cream and milk. This is the time of year we must watch the care of cream and milk. These few rules will help you keep your cream of No. 1 Quality:

- 1. Wash and sterilize all milk utensils, such as strainers, pails, dippers, and cans after each use.
- Wash and sterilize all parts of the cream separator that come in contact with milk and cream after each use.
- 3. Cool the cream immediately after it leaves the cream separator. A temperature below 6,0 degrees F. is desirable.
- Do not run the cream directly from the separator into the cream can. Cool before pouring
- 5. Use a cream cooling tank and keep the cream in cold water until it leaves the farm.
- 6. Protect the cans of cream in transit from summer heat by covering them with wet blankets, or use insulated trucks.
- 7. Keep the cream covered at all times to keep dirt and other foreign matter out of the cream.
- 8. Deliver or ship the cream often, at least two times weekly during the summer months.
