NOTICE OF PROPOSED RESOLUTION OF NECESSITY FOR CONSTRUCTION OF SANITARY SEWERS IN SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT NO. 5.

Notice is hereby given that a meeting of the City Council of the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, held on the 11th day of August, 1947, there was introduced and placed on file the Resolution of Necessity hereinafter set forth, which Resolution will be considered for passage by the City Council at a meeting to be held at the City Hall in said City on the 25th day of August, 1947, at 8:00 o'clock P.M., at which time and place the owners of property subject to assessment for the cost of the improvement contemplated by said Resolution may appear and make objections, if any they have, to the contemplated improvement and the passage of said Resolution, at which time said Resolution may be amended and passed or passed as proposed, said Resolution being as follows:

RESOLUTION OF NECESSITY  
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK OF THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That the Mayor and City Council of the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, having fully investigated and considered the sanitary conditions of said Sanitary Sewer District No. 5 and being fully advised in the premises thereof and having duly considered the necessity of correcting and improving such conditions within said Sanitary Sewer District No. 5 in the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, do hereby find and declare it advisable and necessary to pass this resolution and to build sanitary sewers in Sanitary Sewer District No. 5, consisting of main and lateral sewers, as hereinafter provided.

Section 2. That the said sanitary sewers shall be known and hereinafter designated as "Sanitary Sewer District No. 5". Said sanitary sewers shall be constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications prepared by Douglas McKnight, Consulting Engineer for the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska. Reference is hereby made to said plans and specifications which were filed in the office of the City Clerk on the 28th day of July, 1947, and have been approved by the Mayor and City Council of said City.

Section 3. That said sanitary sewers in Sanitary Sewer District No. 5 shall be constructed of vitrified clay or cement concrete sewer pipe, and any other material deemed suitable. The sewer pipe joints shall be constructed of either bituminous material or cement mortar. In advertising for bids, bids shall be asked for on both kinds of sewer pipe and both kinds of sewer pipe joints.

Section 4. That said sanitary sewers, consisting of main sewers and lateral sewers, shall be constructed in said Sanitary Sewer District No. 5 in the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, and the locations, terminal points, and size of sewers constituting said sanitary sewers shall be as follows: to-wit:

SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT NO. 5  
MAIN SEWER  
An 8" main sewer beginning at the city combination storm sewer and sanitary sewer and 5' west of the west lot line of Block 48, City of Plattsmouth, Cass County, Nebraska, thence south a distance of 100' thence east to a distance of 150' to the alley of Block 48 in the City of Plattsmouth, thence south along the alley a distance of 425' to Lot 4, Block 65, in the City of Platts-

mouth, thence in a southwesterly direction in a distance of approximately 220' to a point on the west lot line of Second Street and 30' north of the north lot line of Rock Street.

LATERAL SEWERS  
Lateral No. 1. An 8" sewer lateral beginning at the intersection of Gold Street and Second Street, thence north along Second Street a distance of 443' to connect with the main sewer.

Lateral No. 2. An 8" sewer lateral beginning at the intersection of Gold Street and Second Street, thence east along Gold Street a distance of 375' to First Street, thence north along First Street a distance of 360'.

Lateral No. 3. An 8" sewer lateral beginning at the intersection of Gold Street and First Street, thence south along First Street a distance of 1160'.

Section 5. The kind of sewers proposed to be constructed shall be sanitary sewers.

Section 6. To pay the cost of said improvements, the City shall, after the improvements are completed and accepted, issue its negotiable bonds known as "Sewer Bonds" for Sanitary Sewer District No. 5. The cost of such portions of said improvement as are local improvements, shall be assessed to the extent of special benefits upon properties found to be especially benefited thereby in accordance with the laws of the State of Nebraska, which assessments when collected, shall be set aside and constitute a sinking fund for the payment of said bonds. The City shall cause to be levied and collected annually upon all the taxable property in the City, a tax which, together with such sinking fund, derived from the special assessments, shall be sufficient to meet payments of interest and principal of said bonds as the same become due, said tax shall be known as a Sewer Tax and be payable annually in money.

Section 7. There shall be, and there is hereby created, in said City, Sewer District known as Sanitary Sewer District No. 5. The outer boundaries of said District are as follows: SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT NO. 5

Commencing at the intersection of the north line of Holdrege Street and the west line of First Street in Thompson's Addition, City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska:

Thence west on the north line of Holdrege Street a distance of 293' to the east line of Second Street, thence north on the east line of Second Street a distance of 900' to the south line of Silver Street, thence west on the south line of Silver Street a distance of 210' to the east line of the alley of Block 4, Thompson's Addition;

Thence north along the east line of the alley a distance of 457' to the north line of Gold Street;

Thence west on the north line of Gold Street a distance of 55' to the west line of Block 171, in the City of Plattsmouth;

Thence north along the west line of Block 171 a distance of 373' to the north line of Rock Street;

Thence in a northeasterly direction a distance of 425' to the southwest corner of Block 48, in the City of Plattsmouth;

Thence north along the west line of Block 48 a distance of 895' to the north line of Granite Street;

Thence east along the north line of Granite Street a distance of 140' to the west line of the alley of Block 48, in the City of Plattsmouth;

Thence in a southwesterly direction along the west line of Livingston Road a distance of 765' to the west line of the alley of Block 151 in the City of Plattsmouth.

Thence south along the west line of the alley to the south line of Gold Street;

Thence east along the south line of Gold Street a distance of 55' to the west line of the alley of Block 2, Thompson's Addition;

Thence south along the west line of the alley a distance of 1277' to the north line of Holdrege Street, thence west along the north line of Holdrege Street a distance of 210' to the point of beginning;

The Engineer's Estimate of the total cost of the proposed improvement, in Sanitary Sewer District No. 5, is \$9917.60.

Section 8. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, meet at 8:00 P.M. on the 25th day of August, 1947, in the City Hall in said City for the purpose of considering objections to the passage of this Resolution and making of this improvement, at which meeting this Resolution may be amended and passed or passed as proposed.

Section 9. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk be, and he is hereby instructed to cause notice of the pendency of this Resolution and the time and place at which said Resolution will be considered for passage and objections heard thereto to be published in two publications of a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, which publication shall contain the entire wording of the foregoing Resolution and the last publication shall be not less than five days nor more than two

weeks prior to the time set for such consideration, and at said meeting. The Mayor and City Council will hear objections to the passage of said resolution and owners of property which may become subject to assessment for the contemplated improvement may appear and make objections to the proposed improvement and if a petition opposing the Resolution, signed by a majority of property owners representing a majority of the front footage which may be subject to assessment for the cost in any proposed lateral sewer district, be filed with the Clerk within three days before date of the meeting for the hearing on such Resolution, such Resolution shall not be passed. Said Resolution may be amended and passed or passed as proposed.
