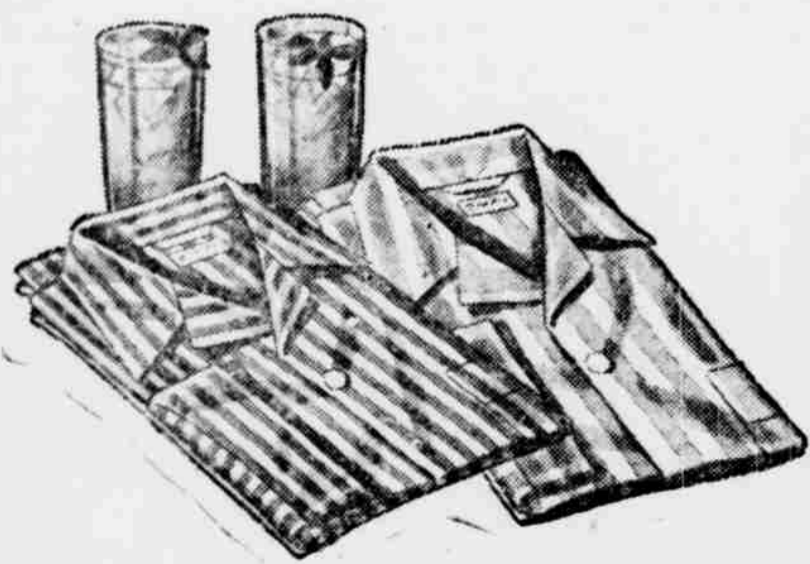

CHRISTMAS FRUIT CAKE

1 lb. brown sugar 1 C soda 2 lb. raisins
1 lb. short 1 C King New 1 lb. citron
8 eggs 1 lb. currants 1 C brandy
2 lb. cranberries 1 lb. baking powder 1 lb. macerated fruit
1 lb. pineapple 1 lb. flour 1 C cloves
1 C lemon juice 1/2 lb. bread crumbs 2 C pecans
1 T nutmeg

Soak spices in brandy. All fruit preferably glazed. Mix soda and molasses. Beat in eggs. Fold case pan placed in pan of water. Cover with greased waxed paper and again with plain waxed paper so crust won't crack. Bake in slow 300° oven for 3 hours.
