Examination For Teachers December 13th

The Nebraska State Teachers' Examinations will be conducted on December 13, 1947 at the courthouse, Plattsmouth, Nebraska beginning at 8:00 A. M. by County Superintendent Behrends.

In order to take the state teachers' examinations, the prospective teacher must be enrolled in or have completed the eleventh grade; except that in order to take the examination in Elementary Courses of Study and Theory and Art of Teaching, he must be enrolled in or have completed the twelfth grade.

Each candidate for the Third Grade Elementary Certificate may purchase no more than three examination numbers, beginning with December 13, 1947.
