Carp Yield Profit To State Funds
Rough fish may be a drug on the market as far as the man with the rod and reel is concerned, but carp, buffalo and shad more than pay for the cost of removing them from competition with game fish in Nebraska's lakes and reservoirs.

During 1947 the Game Commission's salvage and distribution crew sold more than 77 tons of rough fish to realize a net profit of over \$3,000 over cost of seining and selling fish. Carp and buffalo in good condition sold for from ten to fifteen cents per pound, while small carp and shad sold for 30 to 50 cents per hundred pounds.

A shortage of minnows, which became acute last year, is expected to occur again this year in many parts of the state. Minnows are the most important diet for game fish in lakes and streams, and a shortage of these

species can have a detrimental effect on fishing.

Death of Charles Ohm

The message was received this afternoon by Jess F. Waga, of the death at Omaha of his cousin, Charles Ohm, a former Plattsmouth resident.

The funeral will be held Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Crosby-Meyer funeral home at 32nd and Farnam streets.

He is survived by the widow and two sons. Three brothers, Frank, Denver; Edward, Chicago; and Fred, unknown, two sisters, Mrs. Jennie Nielsen and Mrs. Bertha Vanmeter, both of Lincoln, are also surviving.
