**Resolution**  
WHEREAS, by reason of the loss or destruction of the field notes of original surveys, or by reason of defective surveys of record, or because of such numerous alterations or surveys the location of certain roads cannot be accurately defined by papers on file in the proper office, and

WHEREAS, the statutes of the State of Nebraska provide the methods of making and correcting such records and locating such roads, and this Board deems such corrections necessary,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Surveyor of Cass County, be, and he hereby is authorized and directed, whenever any such cases come to his attention, to resurvey, and to plat and record such roads and make records thereof in the manner provided by Sections 39-115, Rev. Stat. Neb. 1943.

A Quit-Claim Deed was signed transferring certain parts of Lot 1, 2 and 16 in Block 74 in Weeping Water City to Ralph A. Kackler for a consideration of \$25.00.

**Resolution**  
WHEREAS an emergency exists in that certain bridges in Cass County are destroyed or threatened with destruction by traffic and by the elements, and

WHEREAS the Board of County Commissioners of Cass County has an opportunity to purchase lumber and piling and employ labor for the work incident to the repair or reconstruction of such bridges and the sum of \$8,000.00 is necessary for such material and labor, and

WHEREAS, it is imperative that such work be commenced at once for the preservation of public safety and public health and an emergency exists, and

WHEREAS, the budget adopted for the Bridge Fund of Cass County is not adequate to meet such emergency, and a temporary loan of \$8,000.00 can be made from the Federal Matching Road Fund in accordance with Section 23-918, R.S. Neb. 1947, to make said necessary expenditures.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that an emergency exists requiring immediate repair and reconstruction of bridges and the purchase of materials and employment of labor incidental thereto, and that the appropriation for the Bridge Fund of Cass County be increased by the sum of \$8,000.00 from \$41,318.10 to \$49,318.10, the said increase being the amount deemed necessary and available to provide for such emergency.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the sum of \$8,000.00 be borrowed from the Federal Matching Fund for the purposes hereinbefore expressed, and that said sum be repaid to the Federal Matching Fund on or before October 1, 1948, all in accordance with and under the conditions and provisions of Section 23-918, R.S. Supp. 1947.
