CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA ORDINANCE NO. 834 AN ORDINANCE CREATING STREET IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER 93 IN THE CITY OF PLATTSMOUTH, NEBRASKA, DEFINING ITS BOUNDARIES AND PROVIDING FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF A CERTAIN STREET BY PAVING, AND SUCH OTHER WORK AS MAY BE INCIDENT THERE TO.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska: Section 1. The Mayor and Council of the City of Plattsmouth, in the County of Cass, State of Nebraska, hereby find and declare: That it is to the best interests of the said City to

create Street Improvement District No. 93. Section 2. There is hereby created within the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, a Street Improvement District to be known and designated as Street Improvement District Number 93, the outer boundaries of which are as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the West property line of 14th Street in said City and the North property line of Lot 5, Block 14 in Young and Hays Addition to the City of Plattsmouth, Nebraska.

Thence East along the North property line of said Lot 5 extended to the Southerly line of Washington Avenue.

Thence in a Southeasterly direction to the East property line of Lot 12 in Block 110 in the City of Plattsmouth, being the West property line of 10th street.

Thence South along the West property line of 10th street to its intersection with the South property line of Lot 1, Block 111 in the City of Plattsmouth.

Thence West along the South line of said Lot 1, Block 111 extended to the West property line of Lot 4 in Block 17 in Young and Hays Addition to the City of Plattsmouth.

Thence North along the West line of said Lot 4 in Block 17 in Young and Hays Addition extended to the point of beginning.

Section 3. The following street within said Street Improvement District shall be and hereby is ordered improved by paving, to-wit: LOCUST STREET, also known as Avenue C, from the West property line of 10th Street to the West property line of 14th Street.

All work essential for or necessarily incidental to the construction of said improvement shall be done in connection therewith as a part thereof.

Section 4. All of said improvements shall be constructed to the established grades as fixed by ordinances of the City, and shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications to be made by H. H. Henningson, Special Engineer employed by the City, and to be approved by the City Council. Said improvements shall be made at public cost but special assessments on the specially benefited property shall be levied to reimburse the City to the extent provided by law.

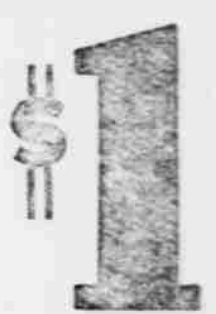

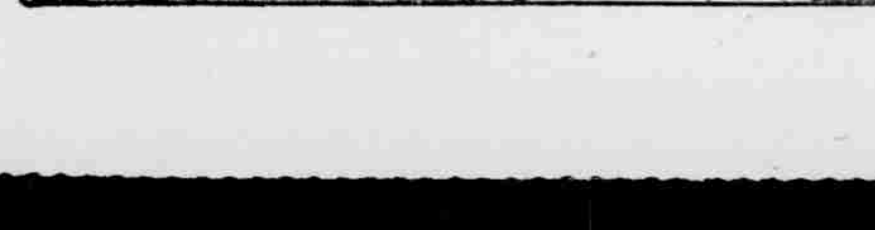
