REPORT of the County Institute Fund for the period July 1, 1947 to June 30, 1948 was filed by the County Superintendent of Schools, showing Receipts \$292.20, Expenditures \$247.11, Balance June 30, 1948 \$45.09.

AGREEMENT entered into with the Department of Roads and Irrigation for further construction on the Plattsmouth-Louisville Road, to be known as Project No. S-82(3), and financed by Federally matched funds.

RESOLUTION WHEREAS, Section 23-113 of the Revised Statutes of Nebraska, 1943, provides: "When petitioned by 25 freeholders of the county, the County Board may expend money from the General Fund of the county for the care and maintenance of abandoned and neglected cemeteries; provided, that no County Board shall expend more than \$100.00 in any one year for said purpose."

AND WHEREAS, the Cass County Historical Society has checked and made a record of 43 cemeteries in Cass County of which number approximately one dozen are now neglected or abandoned; and that the Historical Society has had a petition circulated praying that the County Commissioners may allow \$100.00 for the purpose of rejuvenating and caring for abandoned cemeteries where the early pioneers of Cass County have been buried.

AND WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners are convinced that this is an eminently worthy matter to be taken up by the Cass County Historical Society.
