## Cass County Extension Notes

**Fall Plowing of Gardens Urged**

If your garden is through producing this year, plow it. That's the advice of County Extension Agent Clarence Schmadeke. He suggests an application of barnyard manure to plow under.

But first of all, Schmadeke suggests that all the refuse—old plants—be cleaned from the plot and burned. This, he says, will get rid of insects and diseases harbored by the dead plants.

**Trees to be Available**

Lincoln — Approximately one and a half million Clark-McNary trees will be available for distribution in Nebraska next spring, according to an announcement by Earl G. Maxwell, extension forester at the University of Nebraska.

Maxwell said one million broadleaf trees have been contracted for from private nurseries. The trees include American elm, Chinese elm, mulberry, thornless honeylocust, black lo-

cust, ash, hackberry, caragana, Russian olive, boxelder, wild plum, soft maple, cottonwood and osage orange. The forester said there will be a good supply of Austrian and yellow pine and some jack pine. The supply of red cedar, he said, definitely will be short and there will be a limit of 200 red cedars to a farm.

He said the trees will average somewhat larger than formerly. The price to cooperators will be \$2.00 a hundred delivered. The trees will be available in units of 100 for each species. Applications will be available at the County Extension Office.
