RESOLUTION
BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Commissioners of Cass County, Nebraska, in regular session with a quorum present: The County Attorney of said County is hereby authorized and directed to foreclose, in the name of said County, all Certificates of Tax Sale, the real estate for which the subsequent taxes for which were heretofore purchased in the name of said County at private sale in accordance with Section 77-1809 Revised Statutes of Nebraska, 1943, and this resolution shall be cumulative to prior resolutions.

RESOLUTION
WHEREAS, it appears that J. A. Capwell, County Judge, is disqualified to act as County Judge in certain matters now pending in County Court;
AND, WHEREAS, it appears that said Judge may be disqualified in other matters from time to time or that by reason of illness or other causes, he may be unable to serve from time to time and that it is desirable to have an acting County Judge;

AND, WHEREAS, it appears that Richard C. Peck is a qualified and suitable person to serve in the capacity of Acting County Judge;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the commissioners of Cass County, Nebraska, that Richard C. Peck of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, be and he is hereby appointed Acting County Judge for the balance of the present elective term of J. A. Capwell, County Judge, with bond fixed at \$5,000.00, such bond to be furnished at the expense of Cass County, Nebraska, and that the said Richard C. Peck serve in that capacity as required from time to time by the disqualification, absence or illness of J. A. Capwell, County Judge, but to draw no salary from Cass County, except as provided by law.
