Cass County Extension Notes

Watch for the Terrace Damage: Heavy accumulations of ice in terrace channels may have caused snow waters to break over terraces. Breaks such as these should be checked and repairs made as soon as possible. Great damage may result if the terraces are not repaired by the time spring rains arrive.

Wheat apparently not damaged by ice: In recent tests at the University of Nebraska Experiment Station, wheat plants were removed from ice covered fields and placed in greenhouses, where they were allowed to remain at normal growing temperatures. To date, every plant is making a normal growth.

Although final effects of the ice cover cannot be measured until spring, little wheat damage is expected from this cause.

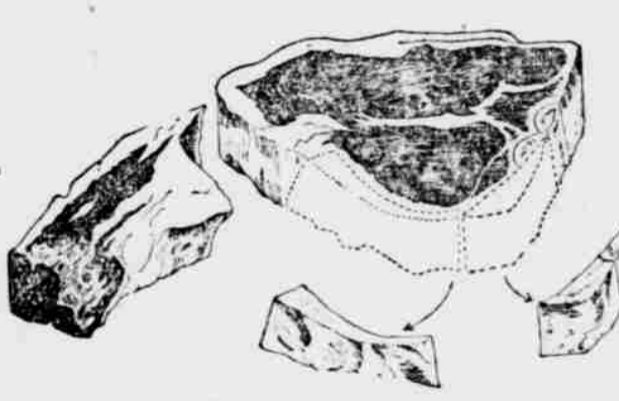
