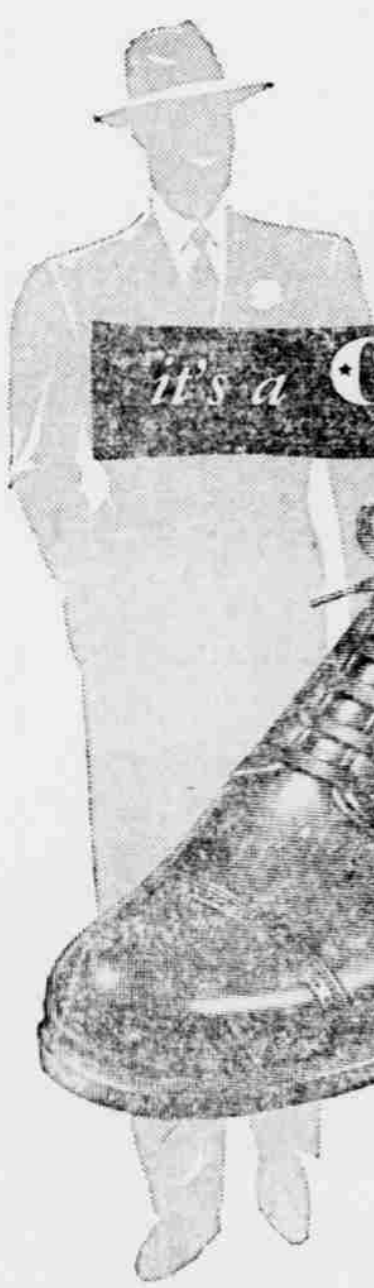

**Insurance Claim Protest Ignored By County Board**

1948 by Chairman Parr Young, acting for the Board, covering compensation for a county employee. Anticipating this difficulty, Mr. Arundel's bid on the policies in controversy, was accompanied by the following letter now on file in the County Clerk's office:

March 1st, 1949  
Hon. County Board of Commissioners,  
Cass County,  
Plattsmouth, Nebraska.  
Gentlemen:

I herewith submit for your approval Standard Workmen's Compensation and Employers Liability Policy No. 657,473 and Schedule Public Liability Insurance Policy No. 385,150, same being renewals of policies which expire March 2nd, 1949.

In connection with the Schedule Liability policy, I wish to advise that we have scheduled rated this policy, and it has been granted a total of 30 per cent discount from manual rates which is a large saving to the county.

In regard to the Workmen's Compensation policy, we received an experience rating from the Rating Bureau and a 12.6 per cent credit was developed. In addition to this discount, our usual 10 per cent filed discount is granted which will again represent quite a saving to the county.

The taxpayers of Cass County have been told that their roads and bridges could not be maintained, not to mention thought of badly needed new construction because of a shortage of county funds. In view of this critical situation I am sure that such taxpayers, many of whom cannot get off their places at times due to impassable roads and washed-out bridges will more than appreciate and approve your taking advantage of the savings outlined above.

The Employers Mutual Casualty Co. and this office have completely fulfilled every obligation required by law in handling compensation and liability insurance matters during the past year. One year ago when you accepted our Workmen's Compensation policy I told you that just as soon as we received an experienced rating on Cass County from the rating bureau we would amend our policy in accord with their findings. On April 23rd, 1948 I delivered to you an amended schedule giving Cass County an additional 15.7% credit.

I am confident that the policies submitted herewith will again effect substantial savings to the taxpayers of Cass County in the form of reduced premiums compared with any other policies submitted, which savings could then be used to good advantage on our roads and bridges.

In the event the policies herewith submitted are low and you award the insurance at a higher figure I will request a complete and public explanation of your reasons for so doing. Thank you.

Owing to the age of Mr. Cummins, 90 years, the funeral services will be held at Omaha the body brought to Plattsmouth for burial in the family lot at Oak Hill cemetery.
