Burlington Station Shows March of Time

The Burlington passenger station on east Main street is bearing evidence of the inroads of up as a very neat and attractive building, but as service has been gradually curtailed and traffic fallen away, the structure is no longer a very attractive place.

Formerly the station had two good sized waiting rooms with the office portion of the building maintained in the center, but now the north waiting room has been denuded of the seats and is being arranged to Sell It Thru Journal Want Ads. handle freight and express.

The wall at the south end of the building is in a very advanced stage of decay and may have to be be removed or replaced. Termites are also adding their part to the destruction of the structure.

A great many years ago the representative of the Journal was asked by the Chamber of Commerce to check each morning, the number of people going to Omaha or other points, and the number of seats that were available. At that time twenty to fifty or larger was the usual haul of passengers. 
