

Educational Week Named By Governor

The week of November 6 through 12 has been designated as American Education Week in a proclamation issued by Governor Val Peterson.

"Making Democracy Work" is the theme for the 29th observance of American Education Week. The event is sponsored by the Nebraska State Education Association, the United States Office of Education, and the National Congress of Parents and Teachers.

In his proclamation, Governor Peterson stated that the "value of community interest in its schools cannot be over-emphasized. Parents and teachers are partners in the most important project of helping pupils gain

the necessary preparation for meeting life's problems successfully. Only through a mutual understanding of the problems faced by the parents and teachers alike can this important goal be reached."

President Truman in his message to the National Educational Association stated that American Education Week "should be a time for examining our communities and searching our hearts to see if we are being fair to our school children and to our teachers in the tools we give them for the building of tomorrow's citizens."

Each day of the week will give special emphasis to a particular phase of the educational program of the schools.

Nearly all schools throughout the state are planning special programs in observance of American Education Week and are encouraging members of the community to visit the schools during the week.

PARENTS VISITATION

All parents of the high school students, and all friends of the school are invited to attend the program at the high school, Thursday evening, November 10th.

The building will open at 7:30, and the program will begin at 7:45 when all visitors will meet in the assembly hall. After a brief explanation of the program for the evening the parents may select the class schedule they would like to follow. These classes will be brief but should be very interesting, and they will be varied in their nature.

Following the visits to classes there will be a program in the assembly put on by the students and the teachers. At the conclusion of the assembly program the class rooms will be open for inspection and the teachers will be available for conferences. The members of the Student Senate will be present and act as guides to help direct visitors about the building.

Nehawka Boy With Task Fleet

Ervin D. Mather, airman, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Alfred Mather of Nehawka, is serving as a crew member of the aircraft carrier USS Valley Forge which is participating in "Operation Mikil," a large-scale amphibious exercise in the Pacific.

The maneuvers, scheduled to continue through October and November, involve nearly 40,000 soldiers, sailors and marines, and are designed to dislodge an imaginary aggressor force from the Hawaiian Islands. General Mark W. Clark, Commanding General of the Sixth Army, is overall commander.

The First Task Fleet is to conduct the assault on Oahu with complete wartime realism. As in wartime island operations, the task fleet includes a full array of Naval vessels ranging from fully loaded tank landing ships to powerful aircraft carriers.

Recruiting For Reserve Is Now On

2473 AFRTC, Offutt AFB, Omaha, Neb.—A personnel procurement campaign was launched today throughout Nebraska and Iowa States in order to bring the 438th Troop Carrier Air Reserve Wing at Offutt AFB up to full strength as a Mobilization Day force in the nation's air defense system.

Lt. Colonel Robert E. Fleisher, 438th Commander, announced that the unit has immediate openings for approximately 700 Airmen of all ranks and positions.

Individuals training with the 438th currently receive two full days' pay for one day of training. After December 1, 1949, he will receive three full days pay for each one and one-half days training. It is ultimately planned for a trainee to receive four full days pay for two days training. In addition the Air Reservist receives points for retirement and credits for promotion just as members of the Regular Air Forces do.

The 438th is authorized a 15-day tour of duty (active) training each year. During Operation "Paradrop" last August the 438th dropped paratroopers of the 11th Airborne Division—complete with supplies and artillery, into the target area at Campbell, Kentucky.

Colonel Fleisher announced that men between the ages of 17 and 35 are eligible to apply; however, for active duty status the must possess the technical MOS desired by the USAFR.

Veterans or persons without prior Federal service may enlist for the 438th Troop Carrier Wing, Offutt AFB, Omaha, Neb. Persons interested may drop a card or letter to the Recruiting Officer, 2473d AFRTC, Offutt AFB, Omaha, listing your home address. Your letter will be answered immediately with details on how you can join the 438th Troop Carrier Reserve Wing.

DON'T BURN LEAVES

Lincoln—Leaves don't need to be burned when the home owner is cleaning up his yard. If the leaves are destroyed the home owner is losing some valuable fertilizer and humus material for his vegetable and flower gardens.

This is what University of Nebraska extension specialists say. They say it's little trouble to establish a pile of leaves so that they may decompose into humus or leaf mold. Leaves and similar lawn or garden trash will not rot more rapidly if the pile is made up of alternate layers of leaves and rich soil or mixed with a nitrogen fertilizer.
