> (1) To consider and adopt an Agreement of Merger, dated November 22, 1949, between this corporation and Ash Grove Lime & Portland Cement Company, a Delaware corporation, which has been approved by the respective boards of directors of each of such corporations and executed by the members of the boards of directors of such corporations and by their duly authorized officers, providing for the merger of this corporation into and with the Delaware corporation, which shall be the surviving corporation.
