WHITE SPOTS ON MAHOGANY furniture can be removed by applying a thick coat of vaseline over the spots and letting stand for 48 hours before wiping off.

Remove old wax with liquid wax to remove watermarks on waxed finishes. Then apply a fresh coat

For other finishes, other than wax, remove watermarks by rubbing oil of peppermint on a damp cloth, then to the surface. Polish dry with a soft cloth.

If you have heat marks on a varnished finish, dampen with spirits of camphor. Let dry thoroughly, then polish.

When heat marks are on a sacquered wood finsh, rub with a paste of powdered pumice and linseed oil, working with the grain of the wood. Polish when spot is removed.

Alcohol stains on wood should be wiped off as soon as the liquid is spilled. Rub with fingers or an oiled cloth. For neglected stains,




