Cass County People Buy \$944,744 Bonds

Cass county purchased a total of \$944,744.00 in U. S. Savings Bonds during 1949. Mr. Walter H. Smith, Chairman of Cass county savings bonds committee, said.

Information released by the treasury shows total state purchases of approximately \$106,000,000 for the year. Mr. Smith said. Of this amount, 71 per cent was in series "E" bonds, an increase of 6 per cent over last year. Total bond purchases accounted for 6 per cent of Nebraska's total income of approximately one and three quarter billions of dollars during 1949.

Payments to bondholders amounted to \$54,780,000 which included principal and interest on matured series "A", "B", "C" and "D" bonds, as well as payment for redeemed bonds of the "D" and "E" series.
