education and emergency epidemic aid. Dr. Gustavson explained that Nebraska county chapters of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis spent or obligated themselves to spend more than \$342,000 in assisting polio patients with medical care during the calendar year of 1949.  
"Even though there should be but few cases of Infantile Paralysis in the State of Nebraska in 1950, the cost of follow-up care for patients carried over from previous epidemics will continue to be very large," Dr. Gustavson said.  
Cass county with a population of 16,992, gave a contribution of \$3,109.88, or a per capita of .1830. Mrs. Vera Warga was the chairman of the Cass County drive.
