Fertilizer Dealers— A fertilizer dealers school is slated for the University of Nebraska College of Agriculture campus, Jan. 3 and 10.

Dr. M. D. Weidon, extension soils specialist at the University, said these are some of the topics which will be discussed at the meetings: Results of recent outstate testing work; fertilizer recommendations by the college, soil types in relation to fertilizer requirements and the role of fertilizers in the soil conservation plan.

Also on the agenda, said Dr. Weidon, is a discussion of the state fertilizer law. A representative of the fertilizer industry will discuss his product's supply prospects for 1951.
