What happened there. Well we just got too far ahead of our supply lines. It was some 60 miles long on mountain roads and we just didn't have enough men to hold the roads plus fight all of them surrounding us. When they say six Chinese divisions, I really think they are underestimating.

My company, with only 123 men, was attacked by a "Chink" battalion. When we ran out of ammunition we were doing everything but throwing the "kitchen sink" at 'em. Today, there are only 18 of us left and we are all hit. That was "Item Company."

"Some day we'll get back at them. They claim we killed 37 of them to everyone of us. I can believe it, those hills were covered with them. Our biggest casualties were from frost bite. Living in weather 14 to 29

below with no fires gets a little bit cold—take me back to North Carolina—I'll sweat it out. As ever, Skeets.
