WHEN THE MULTITUDE had found Jesus in a sequestered spot on the northern shore of Galilee, he was moved with compassion on the people "because they were as sheep not having a shepherd," and he taught them "many things."

Toward evening the disciples wanted to "dismiss the flock" to shift the responsibility. They came to Jesus and said, "Send them away, that they may go into the country and villages round about, and buy themselves something to eat." When Jesus bade the disciples to give the people to eat, they told him they had but five loaves and two fishes. Jesus called for this small provision and he blessed and multiplied the loaves and fishes until five thousand men were fed.

As we face a multitude in need today, let us not desire, as the disciples did, to "call it a day" as long as there is one we can aid; let us not try to pass the responsibility, but let us consecrate what we have to Jesus, trusting him to multiply our gifts and make them to accomplish great good. 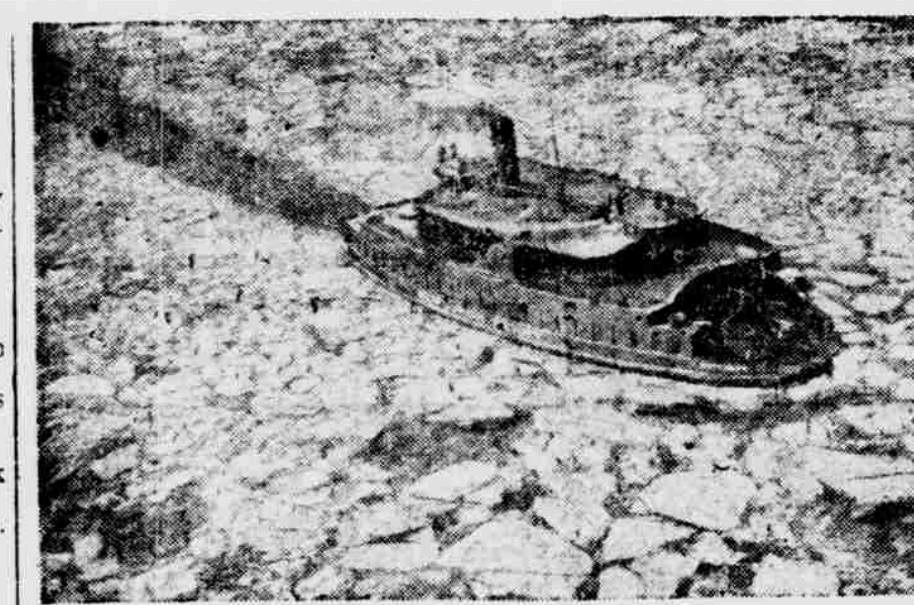
