He enlisted in the Air Force July 1, 1946 and spent 27 months in Tokyo, Japan. At the end of his enlistment he returned to Nehawka but re-enlisted in the Army August 4, 1950. One month later, after training at Fort Riley, Kans., he was sent to Korea. Surviving are his father and mother; sisters, Mrs. Dewey Jones and Mrs. Eugene Ford of Nehawka, Mrs. Wilbur Hennings of Phoenix, Ariz., Mrs. Mary Favors of Lincoln, Mrs. C. J.
