The improved "No Beer Sales to Minors" law requires that a sign be displayed prominently in taverns to inform minors of the new and larger penalties. The Nebraska Division, U. S. Brewers Foundation, approves this requirement. In fact, the Foundation, of its own accord, supplied similar signs for years. The industry's sign proved to be so successful that its use has been adopted by the legislature, embodied in the new bill, and is now mandatory. This is further public recognition of the industry's sincere efforts to operate in the public interest.
