Historical Society Hears Background Of Union Development

UNION — (Special) — Cass County Historical Society met at the Baptist church in Union recently. Following a noon luncheon served by the ladies of the church, a program of Union history was given under the direction of Mrs. Ray Frans.

The early Union post office was started at the home of John E. Beatty in 1861 and its ramifications around the countryside east of the present town until R. W. Frans became first postmaster in the village. The town received its name from the post office.

The history of Union from 1887 to the present day was reviewed. Mrs. Charles Atterberry told of its three churches, Methodist, Baptist and Cumberland Presbyterian, all with good buildings before 1890. A brief history of many Union citizens was given by Mrs. Eugene Roddy. The program closed with a brief account of a nearby ghost town, Stringtown or Union Mills.
